Litter Picking News

The HUGE EARLEY LITTER PICK (H.E.L.P.) Spring 2024

Earley Town Council will be holding its annual spring litter pick covering areas in Earley on **Sunday 24th March.** This date aligns with Keep Britain Tidy's **Great British Spring Clean**; the nation's biggest mass-action environmental campaign. There will be **four** starting locations in Earley, as follows:

- The Interpretation Centre, Instow Road: AM session 10.00 12.30 and PM session 14.00 16.30;
- Junction of London Rd/The Drive (picking in north Earley and Bulmershe Park); AM session 10.00 12.30;
- Maiden Place Community Centre Car Park: AM Session 10.00 12.30;
- Chalfont Park Car Park: AM session 10.00 12.30.

Staff from the McDonald's restaurant off Chalfont Way will also be undertaking a litter pick. It would be great to have a good turn-out from EASI members for such a large-scale and worthwhile litter pick. Litter picking equipment will be provided, but bring your own picker if you prefer, and please bring your own gloves.

Recycling and Waste Collection News



Wokingham Borough Council's February Newsletter on Rubbish and Recycling features the latest information on the borough's proposed changes to waste collection and recycling. **Blue Bags:** A final roll of 20 blue general rubbish bags will have been delivered to most households in Wokingham Borough by Friday 22 March. These are to cover the period from April until mid-August, when the council will be

switching most properties to **fortnightly** rubbish collections from a 180-litre **black wheeled bin** which will be delivered to households from late May onwards. They are not, however, to be used until mid-August. Residents can look up their blue bin bag delivery date on the council's website.

Recycling: Recycling collections are also changing. From mid-August, recycling will be collected **fortnightly** on the weeks when the wheeled rubbish bins aren't emptied. WBC has published an example collection schedule for most households from August 2024 (right). **Food waste** collections are staying **weekly** and there is no change to the subscription **fortnightly** garden waste collections.

WBC's Recycling Rate

Wokingham Borough's recycling rate has increased to 57 per cent compared to last year's recycling rate at 54 per cent, while almost a decade ago it stood at 34 per cent. The borough was most recently placed 42nd for recycling out of 333 English councils, up from 204th in 2018 and 80th in 2020. A recent look through blue general waste bags put out for collection in certain streets found, however, that 62 per cent of the average contents were materials that could have been recycled. This means that there's plenty of opportunity to improve recycling rates.
